



Kodak American Greenways Now Accepting Proposals

This program targets land trusts, local governments, and other organizations to submit small greenway project grants. Funded projects typically advance one or more of the program goals — catalyzing new greenway projects, assisting grassroots greenway organizations, leveraging additional money for conservation and greenway development, and promoting use and enjoyment of greenways.

For 2010, the program anticipates awarding up to 50 percent of the grants to greenways projects that involve natural, cultural, or socio-political historical themes. Some examples of previous recipient projects include an addition to the historic Lewis and Clark Trail, the conversion of an abandoned rail line into a multi-use public trail along the historic Mission Zanja irrigation canal, and the construction of a trail connecting historically black colleges and universities in Tennessee.

Most grants will range from \$500 to \$1,000 each, with no grant exceeding \$2,500. For more information and to apply, [click here](#): Application deadline: June 15, 2010.
